If It's Not One Thing, It's Another

Borrowing a famous line from Rosanna Rosanna-danna (AKA the late Gilda Radner of early Saturday Night Live episodes), "If it's not one thing it's another!" Every property owner understands this, and so do we.

When our beloved Lakewood Masonic Temple was designed and constructed over a century ago, no expense was spared in incorporating the finest materials, artisans and design concepts. While the materials and artistic inputs have largely survived the test of time, some of the design concepts haven't worked out quite as well.

It took only a couple decades before the underground condensate return lines from the ground floor radiators to the boiler sprang leaks and had to be re-piped above ground, except for the re-piped sections that had to be buried to cross doorways, which lasted several more decades before needing replacement themselves.

We've been more fortunate with underground electrical conduits, with only a couple failing and needing replacement in the past two decades (knock wood!). But we know the time will come for us replace the survivors (knock wood again!).

Galvanized water lines and asbestos pipe insulation were the standard a century ago, but have since been replaced as standards with copper pipes and fiberglass insulation. These have been the objects of our most recent projects. Over the summer and fall, the asbestos heating pipe insulation in our Banquet Room and adjacent common spaces was removed and dispatched per legal requirements to asbestos heaven (or hell, if you prefer!); and those

pipes re-covered with modern fiberglass insulation. While working in the area, the remaining galvanized cold water lines running through the Banquet Room were removed and replaced with copper.

Because of the size of our facility, these projects cost many thousands of dollars. And because of the generosity of our donors, we were able to pay for them without increasing assessments to our member organizations.

We have more projects ahead of us, for which we need your continuing support. Gifts and bequests to our Lakewood Masonic Foundation (but not our Lakewood Masonic Temple Endowment Fund or our Lakewood Masonic Temple Company Operating Fund) are deductible for federal estate and income taxes to the extent permitted by law. Charitable Giving Incentives

The federal government's COVID-19 response included several CARES Act incentives for 2021:

—taxpayers using the standard deduction can claim a \$300 "above the line" deduction for cash gifts to public charities such as our Lakewood Masonic Foundation; \$600 if married filing jointly.

—taxpayers can deduct cash donations to public charities up to 100% of adjusted gross income, not just 60%.

—IRA owners aged 70½ and over must resume taking minimum required distributions; but gifts to public charities made directly from IRAs count as RMDs and don't incur federal income tax.

New Ways to Donate to our Foundation

Facebook users may donate through our Facebook page. Facebook does not charge a fee to our Lakewood Masonic Foundation or other not-for-profit organizations.



Holders of traditional (not Roth) IRAs must begin taking required minimum distributions (RMDs) in the year they turn age 70-1/2. Distributions made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our Lakewood Masonic Foundation can count toward your required minimum distribution, subject to a collective limit of \$100,000 per year. Such distributions do not incur either federal income or estate taxes but also do not count as itemized deductions for tax purposes.



Donations can be made after death by naming The Lakewood Masonic Foundation as a beneficiary in your will, life insurance policy, IRA, TOD (Transfer on Death) account or the like, either as a fixed amount or a percentage. A will can be amended by codicils without having to be rewritten in its entirety. In matters such as these, you are best advised to discuss your intentions with an attorney and/or tax accountant.



Gifts may be in the form of cash, securities or property. Gifts of appreciated securities and/or charitable gift annuities can be especially beneficial to the donor. In matters such as these, you are best advised to discuss your intentions with an attorney and/or tax accountant.

Some employers have payroll deduction plans and/or matching gift programs for charitable giving. Check yours.

Gifts and bequests to our Lakewood Masonic Foundation (but not our Lakewood Masonic Temple Endowment Fund or our Lakewood Masonic Temple Company Operating Fund) are deductible for federal estate and income taxes to the extent permitted by law. As always, we encourage you to consult your legal and financial advisors for assistance in determining in what form and in what amount you should make any major gift or bequest.

In the Middle Ages, the Warder was stationed at the gate or on the battlements of the castle, and with his trumpet sounded alarms and announced the approach of all comers. Hence the Warder in a Commandery of Knights Templar bears a trumpet, and his duties are prescribed to be to announce the approach and departure of the Eminent Commander, to post the sentinels, and see that the Asylum is duly guarded, as well as to announce the approach of visitors. His jewel is a trumpet and crossed swords engraved on a square plate.

High Priest's Message

Companions:

As I write this we have successfully completed our Table Chapter in September, raising over \$220 split between our Royal Arch Foundation and our Masonic Home. EC Whitehouse gave a compelling lecture on the High Priest's breastplate and the reason for the ambiguity as to which stones were actually embedded within the breastplate.

I am happy to report that I was able in the months of September and October to visit each of the Blue Lodges that traditionally provide prospective members to Cunningham Chapter. At these visits I was able to deliver an Educational presentation on York Rite Masonry and was rewarded with both submitted petitions and increased interest in our Chapter.

At our November Stated Convocation we conferred the Mark Master Degree on three new candidates, WB Davis, WB May and Brother Nevling. I want to thank all off the Companions for their efforts in what was considered to be an excellent presentation of the degree. We will be conferring the Past Master Degree at our Stated Convocation on December 15. This will be our annual Inspection, and I invite all of our Companions to attend and lend their support.

The "Light Up Lakewood" parade will be returning this year on December 4. Once again the Masonic bodies, including Cunningham Chapter, of our Lakewood Temple will be marching in the parade. I encourage all Companions, their families and friends to march with us. This is an excellent way to support the local community and entice interest in Masonry.

The next portion of this update is difficult but unfortunately necessary; and while I would prefer to address this in another format, this is the only way we have to communicate with some of our members. Our October Stated Convocation included a lengthy discussion on the non-payment of dues. Unfortunately, as of this writing we currently have only 60 of our 105 members who have paid their dues this year; and 18 Companions are more than two years overdue. It currently costs us \$50 annually per member for

The twenty-second and last Grand Master of the Templars at the destruction of the Order in the fourteenth century. He was born about the year 1240, at Besançon, in Burgundy, being descended from a noble family. He was received into the Order of Knights Templar in 1265, by Imbert de Peraudo, Preceptor of France, in the Chapel of the Temple at Beaune. He immediately proceeded to Palestine, and greatly distinguished himself in the wars against the infidels, under the Grand Mastership of William de Beaujeu. In 1298, while absent from the Holy Land, he was unanimously elected Grand Master upon the death of Theobald Gaudinius. In 1305, he was summoned to France by Pope Clement V, upon the pretense of a desire, on the part of the Pontiff, to effect a coalition between the Templars and the Hospitalers. He was received by Philip the Fair, the treacherous King of France, with the most distinguished honors, and even selected by him as the godfather of one of his children. In April, 1307, he repaired, accompanied by three of his knights, to Poitiers, where the Pope was then residing, and as he supposed satisfactorily exculpated the Order from the charges which had been preferred against it. But both Pope and King were guilty of the most infamous deceit. On September 12, 1307, the order was issued for the arrest of the Templars, and De Molay endured an imprisonment for five years and a half, during which period he was subjected to the utmost indignities and sufferings for the purpose of extorting from him a confession of the guilt of the Order. But he was firm and loyal, and on March 11, 1314, he was publicly burnt in front of the Cathedral of Nôtre Dame, in Paris. When about to die, he solemnly affirmed the innocence of

our Lakewood Temple Company and \$8 annually per member to our Grand Chapter for a total of \$58 per man before we even begin to pay our other bills. Our dues are currently \$40 per year. Fortunately, our Temple Company has rebated part of our annual assessment the last few years; but we cannot rely on this indefinitely. Therefore, with the consent of our Chapter, we will begin the process of suspending anyone more than one year overdue. We will give these Companions until January 2022 to pay their dues or face suspension. I want to emphasize that our Chapter does not want to do this, but the economics dictate something must be done. As always, if you cannot pay your dues due to hardship, we will remit them. But we cannot do so if you don't tell us. I realize many of our Companions overdue may believe that they demitted from the Chapter; but, according to the Code, to demit a member must be in good standing (meaning dues paid up) and have submitted the proper paperwork. If you don't have documentation from the Secretary of our (or your former) Chapter, then you did not demit. Companions suspended by their Chapter must, by the Code, be suspended from Council, Commandery and similar appendant bodies as well. On the other side, if a member suspended for non-payment of dues wants to be reinstated, the member simply needs to submit a petition for reinstatement together with his annual dues; and we will reinstate him. I am pleased to announce that we are in the process of reinstating one such Companion and will gladly do so as often as necessary. It has been suggested that we publish a list of unpaid members, but I do not believe this would be proper, so if you are unsure if your dues are up to date, check your dues card or contact our Secretary to be sure. (If you sent a check and it was not cashed, this is a sign that the mail demons have bumped you onto the non-payment list). This is an unpleasant subject, and neither I nor our Chapter want to take this action, but it must be done. If you are aware of anyone that might be affected, please reach out to them and encourage them to re-engage with our Chapter. There are good things happening at Cunningham Chapter, not the least of which is having exalted seven new Companions last year and hopefully three to five more this year.

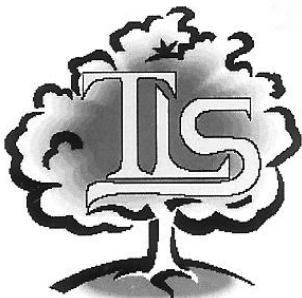
