Water, Water Everywhere . . .

—But Not Always Where You Want It!

Water is essential to life. But at the same time it is perhaps the greatest enemy of old buildings. According to the National Park Service's Technical Preservation Division, "uncontrolled moisture is the most prevalent cause of deterioration in older and historic buildings. It leads to erosion, corrosion, rot, and ultimately the destruction of materials, finishes and eventually structural components."

The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company's recent focus has been on several projects to stop water from infiltrating into our building. First on the agenda was to reset several misaligned front porch steps and re-grout the joints on the porch deck and steps. How does this keep water out of our building? It may surprise the casual observer to know that we have a Custodian's Office on the Banquet Room level tucked directly under the front porch!

Our second project was to clean out the window

well drains on the west side of the building. Did you know there were window wells? Because of the topography, there are none on the north and east walls that we see most often, and most folks have never been inside the fenced-in west yard to see the wells. But the effects of water back-up could be seen in the form of deteriorating plaster on the west wall of our Banquet Room. Much to everyone's surprise, nearly two tons of dirt, sand and debris were removed before water was able to properly drain away from our building foundations. Next on our agenda are gutters, downspouts and especially windows.

These projects cost thousands of dollars, with much larger expenditures to come. Your gift will help us keep rain and ground water outside where it belongs so that our historic home can be preserved for future generations.

Double Your Money

The advent of the Lakewood Masonic Foundation has brought new opportunities to support the Lakewood Masonic Family in a potentially tax-advantaged way. It has also added an opportunity to double the value of your contribution if you work for a company with a Matching Gift Program.

Many employers with Matching Gift Programs will match employees charitable donations, subject to certain limits, to a wide range of educational, charitable and other tax-exempt organizations including those formed for historical preservation. As a 501 (c)(3) organization, The Lakewood Masonic Foundation may fulfill the eligibility requirements of your employer's program.

If your employer has a Matching Gift Program, please obtain the proper form from your employer and include it with your gift. If forms are not immediately available, you can still send your gift to the Foundation and submit the matching gift form at a later date. The Foundation will complete its portion of the form and submit it to your employer's program. Both you and your employer will be recognized for all matching gifts.

Gifts to the Foundation are deductible for federal tax purposes to the extent permitted by law. Gifts to the LMT Endowment and Operating Funds are not deductible for federal tax purposes and are less likely to be eligible under Matching Gift Program rules.

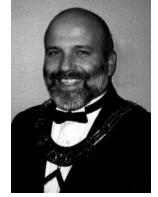

Gates of the Temple

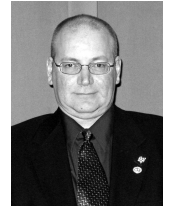
In the system of Freemasonry, the Temple of Solomon is represented as having a gate on the east, west, and south sides, but none on the north. In reference to the historical Temple of Jerusalem, such a representation is wholly incorrect. In the walls of the building itself there were no places of entrance except the door of the porch, which gave admission to the house. But in the surrounding courts there were gates at every point of the compass. The Masonic idea of the Temple is, however, entirely symbolic. The Temple is to the Speculative Freemason only a symbol, not a historical building, and the gates are imaginary and symbolic also. They are, in the first place, symbols of the progress of the sun in his daily course, rising in the East, culminating to the meridian in the South, and setting in the West. They are also, in the allegory of life, which it is the object of the Third Degree to illustrate, symbols of the three stages of youth, manhood, and old age, or, more properly, of birth, life, and death.

Laying aside for the time those artificial distinctions of rank and wealth, which, however, are necessary in the world to the regular progression of society, its members meet in their Lodges on one common level of brotherhood and equality. There virtue and talent alone claim and receive pre-eminence, and the great object of all is to see who can best work and best agree. There friendship and fraternal affection are strenuously inculcated and assiduously cultivated, and that great mystic tie is established which peculiarly distinguishes the society. Hence is it that Washington has declared that the benevolent purpose of the Masonic Institution is to enlarge the sphere of social happiness, and its grand object to promote the happiness of the human race.

Chapeau

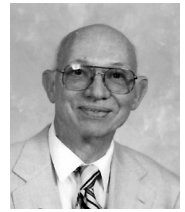
