Operative Masonry in Action in Lakewood

Operative masonry was alive and well this fall at our Lakewood Masonic Temple as a crew from the M-A Building and Maintenance Company completed the task of repointing our building's exterior above the water table (corresponding on the inside to the Lodge Room balcony floor level and up). As part of the project a number of stones on the chimney were removed and reset and various other stones were patched.


By now our faithful readers will recall the admonition from the National Park Service's Technical Preservation Division that "uncontrolled moisture is the most prevalent cause of deterioration in older and historic buildings." The front line of this ongoing battle is a building's exterior; in our case a clay tile roof, a Bedford limestone façade and many,

many windows. Our exterior masonry was last repointed in the early 1980s.

The next important steps in our continuing battle against water will be to replace the Lodge Room balcony windows and to repoint the balance of our exterior masonry. Critical projects such as these are made possible in large measure by gifts to The Lakewood Masonic Foundation and/or The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company. Happy 100th, Neighbor!

When the cornerstone was laid for our Lakewood Masonic Temple in 1915 (see the photo to the right), what was then the Church of the Redeemer's "new" building had already stood for nine years on its corner site across Andrews Avenue. Members of the First Jerusalem Church of Rockport, as Lakewood was then known, held their first service on the site in 1848 in a small frame structure. By the turn of the century the frame building was too small for the number of worshipers and was moved to the rear of the lot to function as a parish house. The United Latvian Lutheran congregation of Cleveland pur-



chased the buildings in 1963. In 1972 the old parish hall was demolished to make way for a new church hall and education wing. In addition to housing the church and the Latvian Credit Union, the Latvian church building is a center for many related groups serving the Cleveland and Ohio Latvian Communities.

Charitable Donations From Your IRA

Last August Congress adopted the Pension Protection Act of 2006 which includes a provision permitting taxpayers who are 70-1/2 or older to make tax-free direct transfers from their Individual Retirement Accounts to charitable organizations such as The Lakewood Masonic Foundation. Note that 70-1/2 is also the age at which an individual *must* begin taking IRA distributions.

Both traditional and Roth IRAs are covered by this change. Other retirement plans such as 401(k), 403(b) annuities, defined benefit and contribution plans, profit-sharing plans and Keoghs are NOT eligible. An individual may transfer up to \$100,000 per year; \$200,000 for a couple provided that each individual has an IRA with at least this amount in his/her personal account.

Distributions must be made by December 31 of each year. Note that the current law applies only to tax years 2006 and 2007. The distribution check must be made payable to the charity, although it can be mailed to you, the plan participant, to forward to the charity along with your personal correspondence.

Your donation to The Lakewood Masonic Foundation will enable us to carry on our important historic preservation, charity and education work. As always, you are encouraged to consult your legal and tax advisors before making this new type of contribution directly from your IRA.

Going Up? New Elevator Installed

Believe it or not, Lakewood Temple now boasts a brand new elevator.

Long hoped for, sorely needed and much discussed—it has been problem no. 1 for many a day. "It can't be done" was the general verdict. The Temple Board, however, is not made up of the type of men who believe things can't be done. They finally worked out a way and, previous to the summer vacation, a contract for the installation was awarded.

The new elevator is of the automatic type with a capacity of eight passengers and a platform forty-five by sixty inches. It was installed by the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company.

You will find it just inside the rear entrance, off the banquet room.

Editor's Note: This original elevator is still in operation. Other than routine inspection and maintenance, the only significant change has been to add an automatic door operator in 1999. The original doors had to be pulled open manually, whereas the doors now close themselves when a call or floor button is pressed. Note also that for the 19 years from 1916 to 1935, everyone had to walk the steps up to the Lodge Room!

High Priest's Message

In a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, we note that the High Priest wore a breastplate, known as an ephod. There are a dozen stones placed on the ephod. To appreciate their beauty, their symbolic significance and reputed magical properties, it would be a useful exercise to ascertain the modern gemstone referents. Having studied Biblical Hebrew and Attic (NOT Koine) Greek and having gemology for a hobby, I will share some recent thought which I have devoted to the subject, hoping you will find it of interest.

If we look at the MAJORITY of Biblical translations, the consensus is that those stones were sardius, topaz, emerald, emerald, sapphire, diamond, jacinth, agate, amethyst, beryl, onyx and jasper. The problem with this method is that emerald pops up twice. The first occurrence shows that the New American, New King James Version, Living, New American Standard, Revised Standard, New Revised Standard and New Jerusalem versions all show emerald, whereas King James and American Standard show this stone to have been the carbuncle (deep red garnet cabochon). The second occurrence has the King James, American Standard, Living and Revised Standard versions all showing emerald, whereas the New King James, New American Standard and New Revised Standard versions show turquoise; yet the New American and New Jerusalem versions show this stone to be a garnet. Clearly, something is lost in the translation.

The original Hebrew lists these stones as adamah, pitdah, bareqeth, nophek, sappir, yahalom, lashone, shbuw, 'achlamah, tarshish, shoham and yashpheh. The world's finest dictionary of Biblical Hebrew, the <u>Hebrew and English Lexicon</u>, written by BROWN, Francis, DRIVER, S. and BRIGGS, C. says that adamah means red, that pitdah, in Sanskrit, means yellow, that bareqeth means "sparkling or flashing" and indicates similarity to Sanskrit markata (emerald), yahalom means to smite, or hammer and then gives conjecture concerning sappir (sapphire?) and yashpheh (jasper?).

The translation of the stone list given for the ephod in Exodus 39:10-13 is based upon Rabbinic tradition and historical references rather than upon the Hebrew lexicon, in which definitions for most of these terms are not provided since the words are loan words from languages other than Hebrew. In this context, I point out that tarshish means "Tarsus," i.e. a Biblical site in modern Turkey.

Some have suggested that this list can be clarified in light of the stone list found in Revelation 21:19-20, which lists, in Koine Greek, the stones of the foundation of the city (which were probably the same as the set of stones in the Temple foundation as reported in Josephus) as iaspis, sappheiros, chalkedon, smaragdos, sardonyx, sardius, chrusolithos, berullos, topazion, chrusopasus, huykinthus and amethustos. Koine Greek, being an Indo-European language and more modern than Biblical Hebrew, looks quite a bit like English, where equivalents could well be jasper, sapphire, chalcedony, emerald, sardoyx, sardius, chrysolite, beryl, topaz,

chrysoprase, hyacinth (red zircon) and amethyst. Unfortunately, language changes over time. Iaspis, in Greek, once meant an orange stone (probably a red or cinammon colored zircon) and later, a blue stone, perhaps the sapphire. Sardius is a form of chalcedony, probably the variety now known as carnelian, which is orange to deep red in color. Chrysolite is olivine, one variety of which is known as peridot. Chrysoprase (literally "golden leek") is a translucent green or yellow stone, the green variety often seen as a simulant for jade. The color of jasper varies from brick red to brownish red. Chalcedony is a waxy, dull cryptocrystalline quartz varying in color from blue or grey to white.

Presumably, the lists in Exodus and Revelation refer to the same stones. To confound the matter, some Biblical scholars (this paragraph from Barclay's Study Bible) have said that jasper was not the modern opaque stone, but rather a translucent crystal, green in color. That the sapphire in question was not modern sapphire, but a sky-blue stone, flecked with gold, most likely lapis lazuli. They state that the chalcedony mentioned here had a green sheen like that found on a dove's neck or a peacock's tail. They say that the sardonyx was an onyx in which the white was broken by layers of red and brown. Sard received its name from Sardis, another Biblical site in Turkey, and was blood red in color. Pliny described this chrysolite as having a golden radiance, perhaps a yellow beryl or a golden jasper. Some scholars say that the beryl mentioned in the Biblical text was sea blue or sea green. They also say that the topaz mentioned here was a transparent greenish-gold stone. Ancient writers say that the jacinth was a violet or bluish-purple stone, perhaps what we now know as sapphire. They also say that the amethyst was similar to the jacinth, but more brilliant.

It should be noted that the zodiac attributes stones to each of the signs and the list is as follows: Aries-Amethyst, Taurus-Jacinth, Gemini-Chrysoprase, Cancer-Topaz, Leo-Beryl, Virgo-Chrysolite, Libra-Carnelian, Scorpio-Sardonyx, Saggitarius-Emerald, Capricorn-Chalcedony, Aquarius-Sapphire, Pisces-Jasper.
