A Snapshot in Time



When our beloved Lakewood Masonic Temple was being built in 1915-16, a little rain made for a muddy construction site and some wet bricks and limestone blocks but no undue damage. (No, that's not the rubbish of the Temple in the foreground. Those are bricks which were used in the exterior walls behind the limestone facade.)

Nine decades later, however, water is a damaging force when it invades our historic home via eroded mortar joints, aging windows or a cracked roof. Concrete and plaster spall, and paint peels. Worse than any visual distress, though, is the real danger of hidden structural deterioration.

Our next steps in our continuing battle against water will be to replace our boiler room roof, replace our Lodge Room balcony windows and repoint the balance of our exterior masonry. Critical projects such as these are made possible in large

measure by gifts to The Lakewood Masonic Foundation and/or The Lakewood Masonic Temple Company. Donors desiring preferred federal tax treatment will want to donate to our Foundation. Whence Come We?

We often hear that our attendance suffers because so many of our members and families have moved away from Greater Cleveland over the years. An analysis of our newsletter mailing list belies that assertion. Of the 748 Lakewood Masonic Family households on our list, 360 (48%) are in Cuyahoga County; 152 (20%) are in adjacent county areas ranging from Avon Lake, Elyria, Lorain and North Ridgeville on the west side to Brunswick, Medina and Streetsboro on the south side to Chagrin Falls, Mentor and Willoughby on the east side. Taking these together, over twothirds (68%) of our addressees are within a reasonable driving distance of our historic home. Of the remainder of our households, 31 (4%) are elsewhere in Ohio, 189 (25%) are in 33 other states and 16 (2%) are in foreign lands including Canada, Germany, Hungary and Japan.

Need a ride or want to car pool to meetings and activities? Call your presiding officer or secretary with your request, and they will do their best to make suitable arrangements. Come back regularly to our historic home and experience the fraternal and aesthetic joy that cements us together.

Our Boiler Room Has Its Own Roof??

And just where is our boiler room anyway?

Back in 1916 boilers were stoked with coal and topped up with water using actual human beings as operators. This was long before the days when automatic coal and water feed systems came into general use, and several decades before coal was generally replaced by fuel oil or natural gas. An improperly managed boiler might just explode with a resulting risk to people and property.

Perhaps for that reason, and also to save space within the building proper, our boiler room (along with others of that era) was built outside the footprint of our building. It is adjacent to the west wall of the building, one level below the Banquet Room. It was originally accessed by going outside and entering a separate door. A hallway was later constructed connecting the dishwashing room to the boiler room entrance.

Our boiler room has its own flat roof, complicated further by the joint with the add-on hallway roof. While the clay tile roof of our Temple has the potential to last for hundreds of years, flat roofs must be replaced every 20 years or so. That time is now.

Our present boiler room roof merely drains onto the adjacent parking lot, causing ice problems in winter. This time around we are going to eliminate this problem as well by adjusting the roof pitch and installing drains to carry the runoff to our storm sewer.

External Qualifications

The external qualifications of candidates for initiation are those which refer to their outward fitness, based upon the exhibited moral and religious character, the established reputation, the frame of body, the constitution of the mind, and social position. Hence they are divided into Moral, Religious, Physical, Mental, and Political for which see Qualifications of Candidates. The expression in the instruction, that "it is the internal and not the external qualifications that recommend a man to be made a Freemason," it is evident, from the context, refers entirely to "worldly wealth and honors," which, of course, are not to be taken into consideration in inquiring into the qualifications of a candidate.

Internal Qualifications

Those qualifications of a candidate which refer to a condition known only to himself, and which are not patent to the world, are called *internal qualifications*. They are: That he comes forward by his own free-will and accord, and unbiased by the solicitations of others; that he is not influenced by mercenary motives, and that he has a disposition to conform to the usages of the Order. The knowledge of these can only be obtained from his own statements, and hence they are included in the preliminary questions which are proposed before initiation.

High Priest's Message

Fraternal Greetings, Companions. The officers extend you all best wishes for the New Year. This newsletter sees us on the eve of our Inspection, which will be in the Most Excellent Master Degree on Wednesday, February 28. As you know, I have always been a strong believer in Masonic Education, thus I always try to include some educational material in our newsletter articles; and this is no exception.

Throughout history, men have tried to explain their views of deity. It is true that "to define is to limit" and man, being too puny to set limit on deity, realized that it is not possible to define deity. The Chinese religious text known as the Tao Te Ching says "Look, and it can't be seen. Listen and it can't be heard. Reach and it can't be touched"; it also says "The Tao that can be spoken of is not the eternal Tao and the name that can be named is not the eternal name"; one of our Commandments says "Thou shalt make no graven image," sharing the wisdom that God defies description, for God is ineffable. God told Moses, "I AM THAT I AM" (Ex 3:14). Jewish tradition considers it a sin to write or speak the name of God. Still, man has tried to put it in words. Early man chose animals to represent the various aspects of deity. Later, man had many gods, attributing different characteristics of divinity to each element of his pantheon. Still later, monotheistic man spoke of a single deity, but used different names to describe the various attributes of deity. One such set of names is known collectively as the "redemptive names of deity," often cited by evangelists F.F. Bosworth and C.I. Scofield. This concept dates back to the ancient Jewish people and is evident in the 23rd Psalm. The number of such names varies, but usually includes at least seven of the following:

Jehovah-jireh God the provider, divine providence

Jehovah-nissi God is my banner
Jehovah-shalom God is peace
Jehovah-shammah God is "there"
Jehovah-tsidkenu God is just
Jehovah-rapha God the healer
Jehovah-m'kadesh Jehovah-tsaboath The Lord of Hosts

Jehovah-elyon God on high

Jehovah-raah The Lord, my shepherd

Jehovah-hoseenu God our Creator

I ask that you read the 23rd Psalm in light of these names: The Lord is my shepherd (Jehovah raah), I shall not want (Jehovah jireh). He maketh me to lie down in green pastures (Jehovah shalom), he leadeth me beside the still waters (Jehovah raah), he restoreth my soul (Jehovah rapha); he leadeth me in the path of righteousness for his name's sake (Jehovah tsidkenu). Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil (Jehovah nissi), for Thou art with me (Jehovah nissi). Thy rod and Thy staff, they comfort me (Jehovah raah). Thou preparest a table before me in *(continued on page 9)*

God

A belief in the existence of God is an essential point of Speculative Freemasonry—so essential, indeed, that it is a landmark of the Order that no Atheist can be made a Freemason. Nor is this left to an inference; for a specific declaration to that effect is demanded as an indispensable preparation for initiation. Hence Hutchinson says that the worship of God "was the first and corner-stone on which our originals thought it expedient to place the foundation of Masonry." The religion of Freemasonry is cosmopolitan, universal; but the required belief in God is not incompatible with this universality; for it is the belief of all peoples. "Be assured," says Godfrey Higgins, "that God is equally present with the pious Hindoo in the temple, the Jew in the synagogue, the Mohammadan in the mosque, and the Christian in the church." There never has been a time since the revival of Freemasonry, when this belief in God as a superintending power did not form a part of the system. The very earliest lectures that are extant, going back almost to the beginning of the eighteenth century, contain precisely the same question as to the trust in God which is found in those of the present day

Finally, I add a brief note in continuation of last month's article concerning the stones on the High Priest's Ephod (breastplate). I had forgotten to mention that each stone is associated with one of the tribes of Israel. The question is "Which tribes," for the Bible provides several (29) different lists of the tribes of Israel and some have more than twelve and some have less than twelve and the names of the tribes differ from list to list. I had printed a table comparing these lists and have lost it and I see that it is no longer available online. I've tried to gather as many as I could in the brief time before this goes to press. Master of the Work

The chief builder or architect of a cathedral or other important edifice in the Middle Ages was called the *Master of the Work*; thus, Jost Dotzinger was, in the fifteenth century, call the Master of the Work at the Cathedral of Strasburg. In the Middle Ages the *Magister Operis* was one to whom the public works was entrusted. Such an officer existed in the monasteries. He was also called *Operarius* and *Magister Operarum*. Du Cange says that kings had their *Operarii*, *Magistri Operarum* or Masters of the Works. It is these Masters of the Works whom Anderson has constantly called Grand Masters. Thus, when he says (*Constitutions*, 1738, page 69) that "King John made Peter de Cole-Church Grand Master of the Masons in rebuilding London bridge," he should have said that he was appointed *Operarius* or Master of the Works. The use of the correct title would have made Anderson's history more valuable.
